Lake Edinboro Sportsmans Club Youth Trapshooting Team Accomplishments/Highlights

The 2020 season was challenging for our program due the pandemic. Though there were set-backs to getting the season started, the youth shooters were still able to participate in three major shooting competitions.

We had an outstanding season with great individual and team results during their competitive season. Many of our youth recorded personal best scores during competitions and several recorded their first "25", "50", "75" and "100" straight targets. Because of the government restrictions, we were not able to begin our shooting program until Mid-May. Several of the early season competitions were cancelled or postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The PA State SCTP and AIM championship was the first event. Due to the shortened timeline to commit to participate we had only 3 youth participate in the event. The next event was the Ohio State SCTP championships. We had 17 of the 20 youth participate in this event. Hailley Ruhl finished Top female Non-resident competitor in the event. Our Intermediate-Advanced squad of Ian Anderson, Brody Beck, Curtis Caldwell, Jordan Rhoades and James Sherman finished first in the Non-Resident category and 6th overall. The Senior Varsity squad of Chase Beck, Kole Repine, Hailley Ruhl, Josey Vittorio and Vinnie Vittorio finished first in the Non-Resident and 7th overall.

The capstone of the season was our youth's success at the SCTP National Championship event. We took 17 youth to the SCTP National championships at Marengo, OH. Brody Beck shot his first ever 75 and 100 straight during the competition and finished in 26th place after 200 targets. The Intermediate-Advanced squad of Ian Anderson, Braden Beck, Brody Beck, Jordan Rhoades and James Sherman finished in 7th place.
